III. Fire Safety Tips and Announcements

Fire Safety Tip: Lithium-Ion Battery Safety

Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions. Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device. Replace cords that are damaged, frayed, or sticky to the touch.
- Charge devices on a hard non-flammable surface. Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Charge in an area with good ventilation and cool. Never in the sun.
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.
