Booth District Park – Dirty Men's Bathroom: Resident send pictures of dirty Men's bathroom at Booth District Park on August 25, 2022. The bathrooms appeared to have been cleaned the next day, but the floors were still dirty. Resident recommended that the floors be mopped regularly and hose the floors down once or twice a week.

Booth District Park – Leaking Water: Board member Aiona reported that water is leaking from the park onto the road in a couple of areas creating water wastage. Please fix the leaks to help conserve water and eliminate water waste.

Nuuanu Valley Park – Feral Chickens: Board member Kurashige reported that feral chickens are increasing at the park. Please have someone remove them.

Ragsdale Place/Puu Paka Dr/Kamaaina Dr – Construction of New Homes: Board members Kurashige and Chun reported that construction of new homes in these areas are creating stormwater run-off over unimproved areas through the neighborhood. Please investigate and implement mitigation measures to protect the surrounding properties. Additionally, Board member Kurashige expressed a safety concern for the bridges in this area from trucks hauling large rocks over the bridges.

Wood Street – Lights at Bus Stop: Board member Kurashige reported that the lights at the bus stop is still too dim and is creating a safety issue for the bus riders and residents. Please investigate.

Dowsett Ave and Puiwa Road areas – Mold on Street/Traffic Signs: Board member Kurashige reported that mold is growing on the Street/Traffic signs in this area and visitors are getting lost since they are unable to read the signs. Please investigate and clean as necessary. Board member Kurashige also reported that a traffic sign on Dowsett Avenue is missing.

Sunshine Law on Board Materials: Board member Chun is asking NCO to determine if the requirements of HAR §92-7 are being followed for Board materials presented/discussed at the neighborhood board meetings.
